From The Desk Of Monsignor Chanel Jeanty

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Isaiah 35:1-6a, 10; James 5:7-10; Matthew 11:2-11 (7). 'Go and tell John what you hear and see.'

GAUDETE – REJOICE!

The third candle on the Advent Wreath, lit at the beginning of this Sunday's liturgy, is rose colored. The Vestments worn by the Celebrant are also rose colored. This color denotes "joy". Traditionally in the Church, this Sunday was known as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is the Latin word for "rejoice" - the first word in the Latin Introit or introduction to today's Mass. Notice the strength of the terminology - not just a statement - but a command. If one could, without being irreverent, speak of God in human terms, it is as if He woke up one morning, looked down on His creation, beheld the flowers blooming, heard the birds singing and the brooks babbling - and saw only the humans with long sad faces! So He addressed humanity in an imperative voice - "Rejoice always - and again I say to you, rejoice!"

This spirit of rejoicing is not meant to ignore the challenges we face, but rather to remind us that, even in the midst of life's difficulties, we are called to celebrate God's presence among us. The rose candle is a gentle invitation to pause and recognize the blessings that quietly illuminate our journey, encouraging us to lift our hearts in thanksgiving and praise.

The message of the Angel Gabriel to Mary was also a message of joy - "Rejoice, O Highly favored Daughter!". The Christmas Angels sang the same song to the shepherds - "We bring you tidings of great joy." After Christ's Resurrection, the Angel in the tomb said to the first witnesses - "Rejoice and be glad. He is not here!" It would seem evident that God goes out of His way to tell us to be glad! So where did we ever get the idea, that religion should be sad or mournful or penitential? We know from the very beginning; God never intended it to be that way. Somebody once wrote - "When you watch religion at work, you find a morality. When you converse with religion in its thoughtful moods, you find a theology. But when you get to the heart of religion, you find and hear a joyful song." A favorite saying of St. John Vianney, a Confessor par excellence, was - "It is always springtime in the heart of one who loves God!"

Joy, then, is not simply an emotion but a spiritual disposition rooted in faith and trust in God's promises. This season calls us to look beyond the burdens and anxieties of daily life, inviting us to embrace a deeper sense of hope and gratitude. Just as the rose candle shines more brightly amidst the purple of Advent, so too does our joy stand out when nurtured in times of anticipation and waiting.

There is time for everything under the sun. Israel had its Wailing Wall, but we also find David dancing joyfully before the Ark of the Covenant. I cannot help feeling that the Lord, too, prefers the latter to the former, the sound of music to the wail of mourning. This sound of the heating the heart springs from a profound awareness of God's abiding love and faithfulness. It is a joy that persists through sorrow, uncertainty, and waiting, reminding us that even in darkness, the promise of light endures. So let us do His bidding and rejoice today and forevermore in the Advent of His coming. As we continue our Advent journey, let us cultivate this joy in our hearts, sharing it generously with others and allowing it to transform our outlook on life.


MOMENTOS DE ADORACION AL SANTISIMO DURANTE LA SEMANA:

Cada dia de Lunes a Sabado y comenzando a las 8:00 am. la capilla esta abierta hasta las 4:00pm para adoracion.


Cada Viernes, el grupo Agape. tiene una noche de Adoracion, y Alabanza y cion y cantos, comenzando a las 7:15pm.

No desperdicie la oportunidad de estar en la presencia de Nuestro Senor Jesucristo. hagase presente.















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
