Seven-Day Prayer Guide: Spiritual Preparation for the Feast of Our Lady Queen of Heaven A Devotional Framework for growth in Marian Spirituality

This 7-day devotional guide is crafted to provide a structured spiritual exercise to prepare for the Feast of Our Lady Queen of Heaven. Beginning with the Solemnity of the Assumption, this framework is designed to deepen spiritual reflection, encourage personal growth in virtue, and foster a sense of unity within the parish faith community.

Purpose and Overview

The tradition of preparing for significant liturgical celebrations through intentional prayer is well established within the Church. This weeklong journey invites all parishioners and ministry groups to contemplate the role of Mary as our Spiritual Mother, drawing inspiration from her exemplary virtues and seeking her intercession in daily life. **During those seven days, morning masses take place as usual followed by recitation of the holy rosary. Evening Prayer Gatherings start at 7pm every night followed by fellowship time in the Parish Hall.**

Day 1: The Solemnity of the Assumption / Friday August 15

Theme: The Glorious Entry of Mary into Heaven

- **Devotion**: Recitation of the Holy Rosary & Eucharistic Celebration
- **Scriptural Reading**: Revelation 12:1 "A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and on her head a crown of twelve stars."
- **Reflection**: The Assumption celebrates Mary's entrance into heavenly glory, body and soul. This event stands as a testament to the fulfillment of God's promises and a source of hope for the faithful.
- **Prayer**: Blessed Mary, assumed into heaven, inspire us to trust in God's providence and to aspire toward the eternal life promised to all who follow Him faithfully.
- Intention: For a strengthened faith and hope in the eternal love of God.

Day 2: Mary, Mother of Mercy / Saturday August 16

Theme: Compassion and Tenderness

- **Devotion**: Recitation of the Rosary / Taizé Prayer
- Scriptural Reading: John 2:3 "They have no wine."
- **Reflection**: At Cana, Mary's attentiveness to others' needs and her trust in Jesus' response highlight her role as a compassionate intercessor.
- **Prayer**: Merciful Mother, cultivate in us a spirit of compassion and attentive care for those in need.
- **Intention**: For awareness of and responsiveness to the needs of others.

Day 3: Mary, Model Disciple / Sunday August 17

Theme: Prompt Obedience and Trust

- **Devotion**: Recitation of the Holy Rosary before Sunday Mass begins
- Scriptural Reading: Luke 1:38 "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word."
- **Reflection**: Mary's acceptance of God's will serve as the ideal of Christian discipleship. Her willingness to embrace the unknown calls us to respond to God with trust and commitment.
- **Prayer**: Holy Mary, help us to discern and embrace God's will, and to respond with the same openness that marked your life.
- **Intention**: For the grace to discern and faithfully follow God's plan.

Day 4: Mary, Example of Humility / Monday August 18

Theme: Humility and Hiddenness

- **Devotion**: Recitation of the Holy Rosary / Taizé Prayer
- Scriptural Reading: Luke 1:48 "For he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant."
- **Reflection**: Mary's humility is evident in her constant glorification of God and her quiet service. Her life encourages the pursuit of humility in both action and intention.
- **Prayer**: Queen of Heaven, grant us the grace to serve with humility and to seek fulfillment in God's recognition.
- **Intention**: For freedom from pride and growth in humble service.

Day 5: Mary, Pillar of Faith / Tuesday August 19

Theme: Perseverance in Faith

- **Devotion**: Recitation of the Holy Rosary & Holy Hour of Adoration
- Scriptural Reading: John 19:25 "Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother..."
- **Reflection**: Mary's steadfastness at the Cross exemplifies unwavering faith amidst adversity. Her example is a source of strength for all who endure hardship.
- **Prayer**: Sorrowful Mother, sustain us in our moments of trial and help us to remain faithful to Christ's call
- Intention: For those experiencing difficulties, that they may find strength in Mary's example.

Day 6: Mary, Queen of the Apostles – Queen of the of Church/ Wednesday August 20

Theme: Unity and Mission

- **Devotion**: Recitation of the Holy Rosary & Healing Mass
- **Scriptural Reading**: Acts 1:14 "All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with... Mary, the mother of Jesus..."
- **Reflection**: Mary's presence among the apostles fosters unity and mission. Her example encourages the entire Church to seek harmony and zeal in advancing the Gospel.
- Prayer: Queen of the Apostles, guide the Church towards greater unity and enthusiasm for its mission.
- **Intention**: For unity among all Christians and a courageous spirit in sharing the Gospel.

Day 7: Vigil of Our Lady Queen of Heaven / Thursday August 21

Theme: Mary's Crowning Glory

- **Devotion**: Outdoor Candlelight procession with the "Statue of our Lady Queen"
- Scriptural Reading: Psalm 45:9 "At your right hand stands the queen in gold of Ophir."
- **Reflection**: The Queenship of Mary acknowledges her unique place in salvation history. As both Queen and Mother, her ongoing intercession and accompaniment are a source of grace for the faithful.
- **Prayer**: Queen of Heaven, intercede for us that we may honor your example and serve others with dedication and love.
- **Intention**: For grace to imitate Mary's virtues and to honor her daily with heartfelt devotion.
- Dedicate this day to intentionally prepare your heart and soul for a deeper encounter with God.

Conclusion: Patroness Feast Day Eucharistic Celebration of Our Lady Queen of Heaven

As this week of prayer concludes, participants are encouraged to continue seeking Mary's intercession and to reflect on her virtues, allowing her example to influence their personal and communal lives. Closing with the Rosary, singing Marian hymns and participation in the Eucharist is how we express gratitude for graces received. Sharing the fruits of this devotion with one's family—through rosary prayer gatherings or acts of service—further enriches the celebration of Our Lady Queen of Heaven's feast.
